Textual Horizon – What does the text say?

Leviticus 19:28 "28 You shall not make any cuts on your body for the dead or tattoo yourselves: I am the Lord."
I. Textual Horizon -Asking what does the text say?
Debate on this phrase: קּתֹבֶת קַעְקַע - "writing tattoo"
Point: From a textual perspective Leviticus 19:28 is a prohibition against tattooing the body as we would commonly understand it.
Context:
Leviticus 18:1-5, 19:1-2
Point: The prohibition for Israel to not tattoo themselves was to set them apart from the nations.
